EDUCATION FUNDING - CATHOLIC SECTOR SLAMS 'SHAM' INQUIRY: Victoria's Catholic education sector has accused the federal government of conducting a "sham" review into the method of ranking non-government schools to determine funding.

In a renewed attack against Education Minister Simon Birmingham, the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria has claimed the current review of the socio-economic status score (SES) methodology — which determines a school's capacity to contribute to its operating costs, and therefore how much money it receives from the government — has been marred by a "phony consultation process" that ignored feedback from stakeholders and input from the government's independent adviser.

The CECV had urged the government to broaden the scope of the review to the concept of "capacity to contribute" - including what it means, how it should be determined, and whether a school's assets or resources should be taken into account — in addition to reviewing the effectiveness and appropriateness of SES scores in assessing

In a report commissioned by the Department of Education and Training, Victoria University's Centre for International Research on Education Systems made a similar point. It noted that the objective, which reflected that "some parents and school communities" were more able than others "to contribute financially to their school's operating costs", required some clarification, including confirming what was meant by a "school community" as well as the "scope of financial resources".

"The minister's own hand-picked advisers share our concerns over some fundamental issues in school funding, yet he has excluded analysis of these issues from the terms of reference for his SES review," CECV executive director Stephen Elder said. "Senator Birmingham's review is a sham. It is ... increasingly apparent the review is a 'tick the box' exercise."

Mr Elder accused the minister of "manipulating" the review to "protect outrageous sums of money his model will direct to some of the wealthiest independent schools in the country".

He singled out The King's School in Sydney, which is set to receive an extra \$19 million over 10 years. According to the My Schools website, the independent boys' school raised more than \$45m from fees, parents and other "private contributions" in 2016.

Schools Victoria chief Michelle Green accused the CECV of waging an "ill-informed and divisive" campaign
