Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Mark 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Persecution of Christians

During August, Burkina Faso, a small landlocked country in Western Africa, faced a horrifying tragedy. Islamist extremists in Barsalogho brutally attacked and killed 200 civilians and soldiers. Just days later, the Diocese of Nouna was targeted. Jihadist insurgents captured and tied up male Christians 12 years and older and took them to a nearby church where they were executed for their faith. The Diocese of Nouna has endured relentless assaults, with numerous churches being ransacked or burned. A moving story from Zekuy highlights this suffering: a local catechist, hearing the approach of attackers on motorcycles, escaped into the woods with the Blessed Sacrament. As he and others hid in terror, their church was desecrated - sacred images were destroyed and the tabernacle was vandalised. Since May, approximately 100 Christians have been murdered in the Zekuy-Doumbala region. Many more have been kidnapped ,their fates unknown.
