



FOR NOTING

Zero Tolerance Policy: In every area of St Patrick's Parish we operate a **zero-tolerance policy**. All who choose to enter these premises should consider themselves bound by this policy. We will not tolerate violence of any kind, especially if it is directed towards parish staff. All violators of this policy will be asked to leave. **Holy Communion**: For everyone coming forward to receive Holy Communion in the hand, on the tongue, or from the Chalice, you are expected to respond to the words: '**The Body / Blood of Christ**, with an audible Amen, **before** receiving either Eucharistic species.

Counselling/Spiritual Direction: It is important that people are aware, that Fr Jeff is <u>not</u> a qualified counsellor or Spiritual Director, whilst he is happy to meet with people when he is able, you may need to seek the assistance of a professional in these areas.

House Blessings: Can be organised via an email to the parish office or directly to Fr Jeff's email, but please be patient, since these are not urgent, they will only occur if / when Fr Jeff has the time.

Reconciliation: The Confessional is for the confessing of one's sins and the reception of absolution - not for spiritual direction. When confessing your sins, please keep it succinct - there is no need to describe what led you use bad language, to be angry, or unfaithful. If the priest needs clarification he will ask you.

YOUTH MINISTERING: Dear Parents and Youth, we will be starting dedicated Youth Ministering in the parish where our youth will be able to engage in ministerial duties during Mass on the 3rd Sunday of every month at 5pm, starting on September 21st. This Mass will be dedicated to youth and ministered by the youth of our parish each month. There is a sign-up sheet in the fover where the names of those interested can be recorded if they would like to participate and engage in ministerial duties. Training for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will be organised for eligible youth members. Please state your name, phone number, and which ministerial duties you would like to engage in during Mass. Please note, the Ministering Duties will be specifically for the 5 pm Mass on the 3rd Sunday of the month.

REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

In his address for the ninth World Day of the Poor Pope Leo pulled no punches: 'Poverty has structural causes that must be addressed and eliminated.'

Christ calls us to follow a path of service to others, not self.

'All of us need charity, here and now', the pope reminds us. 'Charity is not just a promise; it is a present reality to be embraced with joy and responsibility.'

Reflecting that 'all this earth's goods, material realities, worldly pleasures, economic prosperity, however important, cannot bring happiness to our hearts', the pope wants us to consider our 'duty to shoulder our responsibilities in history, without hesitation.'

It is not enough for us to seek our own paths of personal wealth or even holiness without regard for others. We must look beyond ourselves and keep in mind, as the pope recollects, that 'tradition has constantly insisted on the circular relationship between the three theological virtues of faith, hope and charity.' We should therefore be supporters 'of policies aimed at combatting forms of poverty both old and new.'

'The city of God,' the pope points out, 'impels us to improve the cities of men and women. Our own cities must begin to resemble his.'



Entrance Antiphon

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

First Reading Isaiah 66:18-21

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

Second Reading Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves, and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course. any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

Gospel Acclamation

John 14:6

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me. Alleluia!

Gospel Luke 13:22-30

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed. 'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us", but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from". Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!" 'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God. 'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'
