

RESPECT: Fr Jeff kindly requests that parishioners **do not** take anything from the table beside the presider's chair. It is unfortunate if we run out of Bulletins, but Fr Jeff marks his copy with all the announcements that need to be made.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION: If you are coming forward to receive Holy Communion under the form of the Host, you **must** cup your hands one under the other, not next to each other, and you should <u>not</u> have any other things in them, like tissues, keys, etc. You should make a throne with your hands in which to receive the King of Kings. Also, if you are coming forward for a blessing, please indicate that clearly by placing your arms across your chest, hands pointing to opposite shoulders, so that the minister is in no doubt as to what you are presenting yourself to receive.

RECONCILIATION: When coming to reconciliation, you just need to confess your sins. You do not need to go into a lengthy explanation as to why or how you committed those sins. If the priest needs clarification, he will ask you. Also, provided you engage in the Penitential Rite with honesty and genuine contrition, and you also say clearly, 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed, before you receive Holy Communion, you will receive forgiveness for all of your venial sins. Given that we usually have quite a few people who come to the sacrament each week, confessing your sins succinctly means the priest is better able to accommodate everyone, and not have to turn anyone away due to time constraints.
