

Gospel Focus - What's in a name?


It appears from the passage that Mary's child is to be called both Jesus and Emmanuel. Emmanuel is not intended as a different name for Jesus but rather one of the many titles that will be applied to him. The title means God-is-with-us. That one word, Emmanuel, sums up the essence of Jewish and Christian belief. The Jewish people's faith in God was built on the basis that God travelled with them and through their lives. Christians believe that God took on an even closer sense of being with us through God's incarnation in the life of Jesus.

Questions for Adolescents

- Q. How do you think Joseph felt when he learnt that Mary was pregnant?
- Q. What might Mary have been feeling once Joseph knew of her pregnancy?
- Q. How might a belief that God-is-with-us impact upon our actions and attitudes?
- Q. Where do you see signs that God-is-with-us?

Questions for Adults

- Q. Why might the gospel writer have used the excerpt from Isaiah to back the angel's words?
- Q. What social and cultural issues do you think Joseph and Mary may have had to overcome?
- Q. What values and virtues does Joseph display in this episode?
- Q. Why would an understanding of God becoming incarnate have been problematic for Jews?

these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel.
